FROM PASTOR DAVE...

The third of the five daily themes of the upcoming ELCA Youth Gathering is Created to be Free. As the Gathering is in New Orleans, the metaphor for freedom is that of jazz music. Jazz musicians don't always use sheet music with notes. They are free to add their own sound and story to the song as they improvise with the melody or harmony. (Just this past week local jazz musician, Sam Miltich, was explaining to me how he is learning more about improvising on the harmonies rather than the melodies, which is what most musicians do. A whole different approach!) Though they are free to do as they will, they nevertheless do so within the limitations or guidelines of the music. There is still a key signature; still so many beats per measure; still a tempo; still a chord progression. But within that structure they are free to improvise.

Freedom is something we here in the United States of America know something about and are proud about. We say that our country is the home of the free and the brave. We say we are free to pursue life, liberty and happiness. We sing "I'm proud to be an American, for at least I know I'm free."Youngsters, having heard about this freedom, often say "I can do or say anything I want. It's a free country."

And yet Because we live in relationship with others – be it family, neighbors, people in our towns or even in our state and nation – we know (or should know) that freedom does not mean I get to do whatever I want whenever I want. There are laws, regulations and statues to follow. I'm not free to drive on whatever side of the road I feel like driving on. I'm not free to drive without a license. Collectively as a society we have put in place structure and expectations. It's not just about me, myself and I.

The same is true when it comes to the Christian faith. For example, take this passage from Galatians For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. ... For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Galatians 5:1, 13-5

Yes – Christ has set us free. But again, because we live in relationship with others, that freedom is not about doing what we want when we want. It is not about self-indulgence. Rather, we are free to love one another. We are free to serve one another. I am free <u>from</u> dead-end living, and freed <u>for</u> loving and serving others. A very different notion of freedom. But one that allows us – and all – to experience a safe, fruitful, and meaningful life.

In one of our "Getting Ready" meetings the group going to the ELCA Youth Gathering looked at some words by two theologians who have shaped our Lutheran understanding of freedom.

The first was our namesake – Martin Luther - who described the paradox of Christian freedom.

"A Christian is lord of all, completely free of everything. A Christian is a servant, completely attentive to the needs of all. ... It is the very nature of love to be attentive to others and to serve the one who is loved."

-Martin Luther, The Freedom of a Christian

We are completely free. We have been given the free gift of abundant life and we didn't have to earn it or deserve it. And yet embracing that gift changes and transforms us, so that we become servants of all. So that we love and serve all.

The second theologian was Dietrich Bonhoeffer – a German Lutheran pastor, professor and activist who was martyred at the end of World War II for being outspoken against the Nazis. He wrote

"To say that in humankind God creates God's own image on earth means that humankind is like the Creator in that it is free. ... To be more precise, freedom is a relation between two persons. Being free means 'being-free-for-the-other,' because I am bound to the other. Only by being in relation with the other am I free." —*Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Creation and Fall, 62-63*

Freedom has something to do with being in relationship with others and how we live in those relationships – or in the language of jazz again, how we "improvise" adding to the story and song, so that all experience and are able to enjoy abundant life.

We were challenged in the materials to think not only of living in relationship with other people, but also living in relationship with all of creation. The case was made that God is inviting us to use our freedom to care for creation. One thing that defines our relationship with creation is plastic – and our ubiquitous use of it, or even dependence on it. We watched a video on YouTube called "The Story of Plastic", and talked about how we are complicit in degrading the earth through our use of plastic – and not even really thinking about it. The question was asked How does this conversation inspire you to use your freedom for care of creation? And what is your action item? Might you rise to the challenged to live one day without plastic?

"For freedom Christ has set you free". "Only do not use that freedom your freedom as an opportunity for self indulgence." Rather love and serve one another, and the whole of creation. A lesson and challenge not only for the youth, but for all of us.


The theme of Earth Day 2024 is "Planet vs. Plastics".

Traditionally the ELCA Youth Gathering happens every three years – but COVID threw a wrench in that pattern. The last Gathering was in 2018 in Houston. In 2024 the Gathering is in New Orleans. There are four youth and two adults gong to the Gathering from St. Andrew's. The youth

are Kayla Jenkins, Allie Kennedy, Connor Swanson and Greta Zelenak. The Primary Adult Leader is Kim Allen. Pastor Dave is

the other adult.

The Gathering is a once in a lifetime experience for our youth! To be together with up to 30,000 other young people from across the ELCA and across the country is awe inspiring. It is so good to know that there are other youth who are also Lutheran Christians growing in faith – growing as followers of Jesus, like we are. We will be worshipping, learning, and serving together. We'll be inspired by worship and speakers and music and dancing in the Superdome.


Brave – Authentic – Free – Disruptive - Disciples

Additions to the Agenda:

Review & Accept December Meeting Minutes – Motion by Linda Flom, 2nd by Ron Guck MSC.

President's comments - Stops in and checks in with Invest Early typically once a month to see how things are going. Teachers and admin are happy with everything. Expressed appreciation for the Worship Service Groups program, and those who organized/implemented it.

Pastor and CYFM Reports :

- Pastor New Member class, and reception of new members. Seven family units for a total of 25 people. Went to mandatory Boundaries Training; Pizza Fundraising for the ELCA Youth Gathering has been a focus. We now have an account with Upper Lakes Foods, with a \$3,000 credit limit. Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent, was this past week. We just held a Christmas Eve Debrief, with many who participated. That generated good discussion and ideas. We will begin using *Bless this Night* Evening Prayer, for our mid-week Lenten worship services.
- CYFM Feb 4 the CYFM team met; Sunday School going well, Religious Release going well too! So many great questions and discussion last week on Ash Wednesday. Betsy is creating a Google calendar for children and youth ministries/ events. There will be a link for it on our website. Lock ins for both High and Middle school are scheduled in March; Plans are being made for an April Family Fun Night; there will be a "Spring Cleaning" Garage sale in April; starting to think about an overnight local summer camping trip, we would need volunteers for that.

Treasurer report:

Income is up by \$3000, over budget for the month; expenses are down. Year to date income in line with our budget.

We have received a few donations recently from "Required Minimum Distributions". People with investments who are over 70 ½ years old, need to draw down a certain amount each year. If they have that sent directly to a non-profit like their church, they do not pay taxes on that, but get to support the organization(s) of their choice – and the contribution also gets reported on their Record of Giving. Good to get the word out about this.

Council Team Reports :

Financial Planning and Giving – Quarterly review meeting was held last month.

Site Care and Planning – lack of snow has limited need to get volunteers to keep the roof cleared. As far as the repair of the roof and youth and storage rooms (roof first!) we are still trying to get another bid from an additional contractor. We have a lead from a member of the congregation. Currently have an estimate from Geisler. Chris Kottke recently went through the facility with a representative of our insurance company. The council discussed smoke and CO2 detectors. We will follow up with Fire Chief.

Faith Formation and Journey – next meeting 2/28 at 5 during dinner.

Faith and Action – Rascals is starting up and plan on meeting every other month for a potluck. They will alternate between having a speaker and having a social night. At least one of the Worship Service groups are going to try to get together throughout the year to get to know each other.

Old Business:

Office Manager update – Doreen is doing well!

Update on VLM Annual Meeting (Camps Vermilion and Hiawatha) –Ron Guck, one of our delegates, updated the council. Also attending as delegates were Brenda Larson and Kayla Jenkins.

Locksmith - should finish the project tomorrow (Feb 21). After we receive the bill, we will be able to evaluate whether/how to move forward with adding electronic access to the facility through the side door by the Fireside room.

New Business:

Potential Council members - We will activate Nominating Committee after Easter.

Phase 3 build – Long term planning, let's not loose site of continuing to have our church grow. A phase 3 would add space for community events and perhaps a youth center.

Invest Early Lease – The Executive Team will be meeting in the next weeks with the Invest Early Director (and her team?) to work out the details for another year's lease, which the council is in favor in continuing – This was voted upon and approved by the council via an email vote last week.

HVAC – We have replaced two furnaces in the sanctuary recently. But as we have 8 furnaces, each with its own thermostat, we still have several that are (probably) getting to life's end. We need to continue to be forward-thinking budget-wise.

Synod assembly Voting Members – The 2024 NE MN Synod Assembly will be online, Saturday April 2. St. Andrew's gets two Voting Members, in addition to Pastor Dave. The cost, being online, is only \$35 per participant.

Two council members volunteered to serve as Voting Members on behalf of St. Andrews: Conley Janssen, Dan Thureen. Also – the "Living Waters Conference Assembly" is this Sunday, February 25 at 2 pm at Hope Lutheran in Walker.

Rental inquiry – The Seventh Day Adventist Church in Grand Rapids needs to find place to rent every Saturday. 9-1 pm. After discussion the council decided it was not a good fit – due to our schedule. We tend to use our space many Saturdays. Upcoming Calendar Events:


